The development of critical thinking L skills is an essential part of the philosophy of The Anacapa School. Critical thinking is emphasized not only in our classes but also in our annual Synthesis Unit. In fact, the three-day Synthesis Unit is our premier tool for developing critical thinking skills.

Each of our Synthesis Units over the past 27 years has been designed to provide students with unique opportunities to explore in depth a topic outside the regular curriculum. During these annual units, as many as eighteen expert speakers make individual 45-minute presentations on different aspects of the chosen topic. Speakers hold Q-and-A sessions at the conclusion of their talk, and students are encouraged to ask questions to further their understanding. After each Synthesis Unit, students produce "products" designed to "synthesize" the information learned during the presentations.

The topic for this year's Synthesis Unit was World War II: The Greatest Generation. Special thanks to all of our speakers for

their extraordinary presentations. This year's Anacapa students were the perfect group to learn from and appreciate the life stories of The Greatest Generation. The respect our students accorded the speakers went very deep.

After the presentations, students were arranged into seven groups to do further research on the following topics as they relate to the World War II era:

- · Generals
- Grunts and Resisters
- · The Holocaust
- · Leaders

Each student wrote an individual research paper, and each group as a whole made a presentation on their topic to the entire school at a special assembly.
