

Our First Thursday Open Breakfast Club series is open to prospective parents to see first-hand how a Breakfast Club works. This month's First Thursday speaker will be Dr. Robert C. Richard of the Santa Barbara Astronomical Unit.

Bob Richard became interested in astronomy in junior high school and began to seriously explore the use of digital cameras with telescopes in 2002. Bob will present awe-inspiring photos that capture the beauty, magnificence, and sheer size of the Universe as he encourages us to think beyond the physical face of the Universe and to ask probing questions about the meaning of the Cosmos. He will also show how current technology allows amateurs to get photographic results achieved only by professionals a decade ago.
