VERY IMPORTANT! HERE'S THE WORD ON A NEW CA IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT FOR STUDENTS GOING INTO GRADES 7-12 NEXT FALL

On September 30, 2010, Assembly Bill 354 became law. The new requirement affects <u>all</u> students – current, new, and transfers – in both public <u>and</u> private schools in California:

- For the 2011-2012 school year, all students entering into the 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grades will need <u>proof</u> of a Tdap (Tetanus toxoid, reduced diphtheria toxoid and acellular pertussis vaccine) shot <u>before</u> starting school.
- Students need their Tdap shot <u>before</u> returning to the classroom for the new school year. There is <u>no grace period</u> for this requirement.

To circumvent the rush in meeting this requirement and to avoid exclusion of students during the first weeks of school, the health department strongly recommends that parents of all students who will be entering 7th-12th grades next fall make arrangements with their health care providers to receive their immunizations now.
