LOOKING AHEAD TO IMPORTANT DATES FOR THE 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR The 2011-2012 school year calendar was mailed to families recently, and we'd like to <u>call your attention to the following dates</u>:

▶ We will continue our practice of beginning school on the first Thursday after Labor Day. This year, that means that our first day of school will be **Thursday, September 8**, and—in a slight departure from the usual—our family potluck picnic at Leadbetter Beach will take place that evening.
