- Students should arrive on campus with their gear at 5:30am on Sunday, September 11 for our early departure.
- We are scheduled to return to campus at 9:15pm on Thursday, September 15. PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS IS A REVISED, LATER TIME THAN WAS INCLUDED IN THE ORIGINAL TRIP MAILING!
- Trip Recovery Day will be Friday, September 16. There will be no school that day!

The senators and the tribune (the head of the student senate) meet once a week—usually at lunch on Mondays—to plan student activities.

By law, parking is not allowed in that zone. Thanks!

JAYWALKING REMINDER Parents, we need your help!
