PARENTS, PLEASE HELP US KEEP THE FOCUS ON SAFETY!

We ask that parents be vigilant about not jaywalking and not allowing their students to jaywalk—even for school events held after hours. We are very strict about students not jaywalking and insist that they cross any street legally and safely—checking traffic, using crosswalks, crossing with the lights, and observing common sense. The busy—and somewhat complicated—intersection at Santa Barbara and De La Guerra streets can be especially challenging. We ask parents to help us keep everyone safe by using the loading zone. If you do drop off or pick up students from the other side of the street, please be sure that they exit your car onto the sidewalk (not into the street) and that they go to the corner to cross the street legally.
