## **Trips at Anacapa School**

Since our founding in 1981, trips have been a vital part of our school community and culture. Trips have always been wonderful opportunities for students and their teachers to bond and challenge themselves, whether it was on a long hike, cooking meals over a Coleman stove, or walking the urban streets of a major city. What has changed measurably in recent years has been the extraordinary number of experiential education opportunities included in each trip. Great efforts are made to have as many opportunities to learn as possible—and still have plenty of time to relax and bond.

Much thought, effort, and planning go into each trip at Anacapa. To guide their planning, teachers review the basic goals of Anacapa trips:

- Providing opportunities for student leadership
- Supporting personal / social development
- Promoting student bonding
- Fostering positive faculty bonding with students
- Expanding students' geographical horizons
- Learning independent camping and life skills
- Spending time in nature
- Meeting personal challenge—pushing limits to accomplish something that students might not have thought they could do
