

End-of-the-Year Trip Los Angeles June 9-12, 2013

A Note from Headmaster Gordon Sichi:

It's time to gear up for our End-of-the-Year Trip! Included below is important trip information for both parents and students. If you have any questions, please call the school office.

- <u>Departure</u>: Students should **arrive on campus at 6:00 a.m. on Sunday, June 9** for a prompt 7 a.m. departure on Santa Barbara Airbus.
- Food for the Bus: Students need to bring snacks, drinks, and a sack lunch for our full day of scheduled activities on Sunday.
- Return: We expect to return to campus by 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 12. Parents are asked to pick up their students on campus at that time.
- <u>Accommodations</u>: We will be staying at <u>Hosteling International USA</u>, <u>LA/Santa Monica</u> (phone number 310-393-9913 for emergencies <u>only</u>, please). Suzie and I stayed there in February to check it out, and it's a very nice facility in a safe part of Santa Monica.
- What Students Need to Bring: Please refer to the attached list of items needed for this trip. It is very important that your student pack lightly and compactly. A medium-size duffle bag or suitcase would be perfect for this trip. It is ESSENTIAL to have good walking shoes, so please plan accordingly.

- Cost: The all-inclusive cost of this year's trip is \$385. Please send your \$385 check, payable to Anacapa School, as soon as possible and no later than Wednesday, June 5.
- <u>Medications</u>: If your student will need to take <u>any</u> medications (including over-the-counter medications) during
 the trip, please bring the medication(s) to school by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 5</u>. Medicine should be in a clearly
 marked container labeled with the <u>student's name</u> and <u>exact directions for dispensing</u>. Please put the
 container(s) in <u>a zip-lock plastic bag</u>.

- <u>Cell Phone Policy</u>: It is absolutely essential that Anacapa trips be free of unnecessary outside distractions. Our trips are carefully designed to be "in the moment" events to be experienced as a whole with the people on the trip. Calls to and from friends and family take students out of the moment, pull them away from the experience, and go counter to the objectives of the experiential nature of Anacapa trips.
 - Because cell phones are useful in an emergency, we do not want to ban them from trips. Parents are asked not to call or text their student—even to leave a message—unless it is a true emergency. If a student needs to contact a parent or guardian, the student must ask a teacher for permission to make a call. On the way home, students will be allowed to call their parents to update them on our actual arrival time. Students who violate the school's cell phone policy will have their cell phones confiscated. - <u>Emergency Contact Numbers</u>: We will have with us copies of the health and emergency information form you completed upon enrollment. Is yours up to date? If not, please call the school office right away. Also, parents who plan to be out of town or otherwise unreachable at the phone number(s) listed on the form must provide the school with emergency contact information in writing no later than Wednesday, June 5.
