SEPT. 4 & 5 ORIENTATION: GETTING TO KNOW EACH OTHER

School opens on Thursday, September 4 with a two-day orientation for students. The white passenger loading zone on Santa Barbara Street is to be used only for dropping off and picking up students. Please be very careful and move forward as traffic allows and do not linger in the passenger loading zone. We all need to work together to provide a SAFE loading area. By law, parking is not allowed in that zone, and the City does issue tickets from time to time to cars left unattended in the loading zone.

JAYWALKING REMINDER

Parents, we need your help! Please observe Anacapa's very strict NO JAYWALKING rule at ALL times—even when you're attending a social event on campus and especially when you're picking up your student after a trip.
